

Open House and Public Hearing for the Corridor City Transitway Wednesday, December 15, 2010

The Corridor City Transitway (CCT), a new transit system being studied by the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA), would extend north from the Shady Grove Metrorail Station in Rockville to COMSAT, just south of Clarksburg, MD in Montgomery County. The 13 to 15-mile dedicated transitway would operate using bus rapid transit or light rail transit and would have approximately 15 stops. Originated as part of the I-270/US 15 Multi-Modal Corridor Study, a joint multi-modal study initiated by the Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) and the MTA, the CCT would provide additional transit service in Montgomery County.

The purpose of the open house portion of the meeting is to present the new developments to the CCT alignments since the joint SHA/MTA June 2009 open house and public hearings. Beginning at 4:00 PM, maps and other exhibits depicting the studied alternatives, new alignment modifications and associated environmental impacts will be on display. Displays will remain available for viewing until 8:00 PM. Project staff will be available throughout the evening to answer questions.

A brief welcome and introduction will begin at 6:00 PM and will be followed by public testimony about the project and the Supplemental Environmental Assessment document. The time limit for testimony for the public record will be three minutes per person. Testimony can also be provided privately to a court reporter from 4:00-8:00 PM or written on comment cards. A Spanish-language interpreter will be present to assist as needed. There will be no formal presentation.
